





ideas for celebrating World Book Day at school, on the bus, at work, in bed, on a mountain summit, at the library, in hospital, on a night out, in the playgroup, on the beach, in the youth club, in front of the fire, standing in a queue ...











- 3. Fill a shoe box with clues to encourage others to guess the title of the book / name of the character / author.
- 4. Play a game of Pictionary with book titles / names of characters.
- 5. Hold a micro story writing competition (no more than 50/100 words).
- **6.** Hold a quiz matching the book covers with pictures of the authors.
- 7. Play bingo using book titles / book cover images / author names.
- 8. Create a quiz matching the blurb/synopsis with the title / book cover.
- 9. Hold a treasure hunt of book covers or titles.
- 10. Gather pictures of friends / peers / teachers / colleagues hiding their faces with a favorite book from their childhood, or a book that says something about them. Guess who is who.
- 11. Hold a letter treasure hunt with different letters on each card. Who can spell a well-known book / author name after collecting all the letters?

- **12.** Hold a competition matching photos of people's book shelves with shelf owners.




- **13.** Play a word link game using the title of a book / character name as a starting point.
- **14.** Play a game of 'Consequences' using the opening line of a book to start.

## Writing

- 1. Produce a booklet of short stories written by different people you know.
- 2. Write a script of your favourite scene from a book, before performing it using costumes, props, etc.



- 3. Write a special poem to celebrate World Book Day.
- **4.** Create a brand-new literary character, by writing a description or drawing a picture.



- 6. Write a book review. [\*See Temp. 4]
- **7.** Create a recipe book based on foods from different books and cook some recipes.
- **8.** Create a wordsearch or crossword based on your favourite author or favourite book. [\*See Temp. 5]
- 9. Create a magazine of book reviews written by different people you know.
- 10. Create a comic / storybook for young children.
- 11. Create a list '20 reasons why we should read' and create a poster to display. [\*See Temp. 6]
- 12. Put the '20 reasons' above in order of importance.
- **13.** Create slogans which encourage others to read and display them on posters. [\*See Temp. 6]
- 14. Keep a reading diary.





## Design and craft

- 1. Design a special badge for World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 7]
- 2. Design a special bookmark for World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 8]
- 3. Design a special book token for World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 9]
- 4. Design a special book label for World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 10]
- 5. Design some special bunting to celebrate World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 11]
- **6.** Imitate a book cover or design a new cover to one of your favorite books. [\*See Temp. 12]
- 7. Upcycle old books to create new items.
- 8. Create models of book characters using fruit and veg or clay.
- 9. Decorate a door to look like a book cover.
- 10. Design a special poster for World Book Day. [\*See Temp. 6]
- 11. Design and create a special reading area using a specific theme.





## Spoken word, performing and music


- 1. Compose a special song to celebrate World Book Day.
- 2. Record an imaginary item for a radio / podcast program discussing books.



- **3.** Create Story Sacks containing objects and use them when telling a story.
- 4. Create a playlist of songs to listen to when reading.
- 5. Create verbal reviews of books and film them.
- **6.** Create an advert or preview to publicise your favorite book.
- 7. Read a piece of your favorite book or favorite poem to an audience of friends / peers / colleagues.



- 1. Invite an author / poet / illustrator to hold a workshop.
- 2. Create a 'Bring a Book Take a Book' box to encourage an exchange of books or hold a book exchange party.
- 3. Hold an imaginary reward ceremony for the favorite books / authors of your friends / peers / colleagues. Write a portrait of a character from a book you've read.
- **4.** Organize a visit to a local bookshop or library.
- 5. Hold a special World Book Day assembly.
- 6. Hold a fashion show / parade based on book characters.
- 7. Organize a literary tour to follow the footsteps of a famous author or poet.
- 8. Hold a theme party or feast related to a book / books.
- 9. Hold a Reading Café to encourage people to enjoy a cup, cake and book.
- 10. Hold a book fair or second-hand book auction.
- 11. Organize a visit to a local printing press to follow the process of producing a book.



- **13.** Bake cakes on a special literary theme and sell them to raise money for a good cause.
- **14.** Hold a Grand Book Festival, featuring some of the ideas above ideas, to celebrate books and reading.
- 15. Establish a Reading Club.
- **16.** Create a lucky dip of books and encourage everyone to take a book home to read.
- 17. Create a poster or information leaflet advertising some of the above events. [\*See Temp. 6]



















- 2. Present your favorite author / favorite book / favorite character in a 5-minute presentation.
- 3. Create a leaflet about your favorite author, poet or illustrator. [\*See Temp. 3]
- **4.** Create questions to ask in an imaginary interview with a character from a book.
- **5.** Take a selfie whilst reading your favorite book.
- **6.** Choose your favorite quotes from books or gardens and display them in speech bubbles. [\*See Temp. 14]
- 7. Create a list of 10 books to recommend to different friends / family members.
- 8. Take a picture of your pet 'reading' their favorite book.
- 9. Try to summarize your favorite book in 20, 50 or 100 words on a Post-it note.
- 10. Take a selfie whilst reading in an unusual setting.
- 11. Hold an interview with an author / poet / illustrator by email or Skype.
- 12. Take a selfie whilst reading in your favorite place.
- **13.** Create a 'Reading Tree' with the favorite titles of people you know recorded on leaves of leaf-shaped paper. [\*See Temp. 15]
- **14.** Create an exhibition for your favorite book / favorite author, or a general exhibition that celebrates books and reading.
- 15. Create an information brochure about your favorite author.
- **16.** Create a list of 5 books that you would like to take with you on a deserted island.
- 17. Carry out a survey and create a list of the top 10 favorite books of your friends / peers / colleagues.
