The race to become BookSlam National Champions 2026 is officially on — and the good news? There are only two creative regional challenges and four epic national challenges between your team and the BookSlam 2026 trophy!



COMPETING IN BOOKSLAM 2026

BookSlam is a nationwide reading competition packed with fun, creative challenges to boost pupils' literacy, confidence, and teamwork.

There are two stages: the regional rounds, held in your classroom, and the national final in Aberystwyth.

THE REGIONAL ROUNDS

Once you register, you'll need to choose a book from the BookSlam reading list to read. You'll also be assigned a regional coordinator and judge.

Read your chosen book as a class, and get ready for two exciting regional challenges:

Challenge 1: The discussion round

Form teams of four and dive into a lively discussion about your chosen book – covering characters, plot, themes, and more. Judges will join you in your classroom or online to watch and score your team's discussion.



Challenge 2: Create a video advert

Promote your chosen book with a short video advert. Make it funny, dramatic, or surprising – just make it stand out! Your regional judges will score both challenges.

THE NATIONAL FINAL

If your team makes it through the regionals, you'll be invited to the BookSlam 2026 national final in Aberystwyth – a fun-filled day of activities, challenges, and the chance to be crowned BookSlam champions!

Challenge 2: Design a book cover

Challenge 3: Write the perfect blurb

Challenge 4: Cinema showcase of your video clip

All four challenges will be judged by our national judging panel. National round teams will also take part in an extra special author session and cinema session.
